
# Pinecone Gnomes



### <u>Supplies</u>

#### Included:

Medium Pinecone 1/2 inch Wood Bead Felt Twine String Glue Scissors White Paint (optional)

Paint Brush (optional)

## Instructions

- 1— Using your template, trace and cut out the hat
- 2— Carefully glue the sides of the hat together to form a cone (I used tacky glue). It's ok if the top stays open — let dry\*
- 3— If you like, you can paint your pinecones.\*

\*You may want to let these dry overnight

- 4— Carefully place your hat over the pinecone, centering it so that there is a space between 2 leaves for the nose. Tack down with a little glue (I used hot glue for this)
- 5- Glue on your nose (holes should be on the sides)
- 6— Tie a string to the hat and hang it up!
